When Family Studies and Industrial Arts were discontinued in individual schools, the board developed a new approach and program named "Design 2000" for all elementary students. The City program was located at Herman Secondary School and I was selected to train and work with two Windsor teachers to setup and implement this "high tech" program for the City elementary program.

Design 2000 was a great opportunity for me to become familiar with all the elementary schools in the system and to ensure that the program continued to meet the needs of the students.
