Vice Principal's Report – Mr Roy:

Equity Updates:

Rationale:

Bellewood's school improvement goal is to enhance student well-being, inclusivity and a sense of belonging.

Actions Taken:

Bellewood GSA:

- No updates will resume mural for June.
- Students may participate in T-Shirt Design contest for June.

Refresh Committee:

- M. DeLaronde completed the canvas frame and we showed the 4 students how to stretch the canvas and we applied the Gesso (primer) and will be transposing the sketch this week.
- The sketch is completed and depicts a prairie meadow with Bellewood in the landscape and a diverse student population of students representing different races/ethnicities engaged in various learning activities. The students will be wearing different colour shirts to represent the significant days we recognize throughout the school year to promote inclusiveness (i.e., Orange Shirt Day, Pink Shirt Day, Purple Shirt Day, Pride, Purple Shirt Day, Bellewood School Colours, etc.). We included special programming such as drumline. We also made sure that the plants/trees included are what we would find locally in Ontario.

• The Multicultural Fair banner has been redesigned and slotted to complete as next year's project and will depict 195 country flags as well as First Nations, Metis and Inuit flags. We will still have the world with the quote, "Welcome to Ecole Bellewood...where we celebrate our cultural diversity in a community environment." In addition, each flag will be a puzzle piece and we will add the following quote, "The world is like a puzzle and we are the puzzle pieces. We all belong and when one is gone, we're incomplete."

EAST Initiatives/Student Leadership:

- Student Leadership had a Ramadan display on our front bulletin board as well as an interactive activity. They also gave presentations to classes to teach other students about Ramadan.
- Planning continues for Sikh Heritage month (April), Jewish heritage, World Autism Day and the continuation of daily announcements.

Create Your Future:

- We have significantly increased the number of students at Bellewood part of the Create Your Future program 10 times.
- Create Your Future Advisors are assisting with planning the 2nd Annual Black Joy Conference on April 15 the theme: Express Yourself. Four students will represent Bellewood with M. Pallotto.

Map of Caring/Trusted Adults at Bellewood:

- Results of Parent/Caregiver survey include:
- 1. 94% encouraging their child to access trusted adults, 6% maybe
- 2. 81% of students feel safe, 19% Yes and No/Sometimes
- 3. 44% reported positive experiences with trusted adults, 31% no positive/negative experiences reported, 12.5% reported lack of understanding, 12.5% reported negative experiences
- 4. 81% parents/caregivers know their child's trusted adult, 19% do not
- 5. 88% of parents/caregivers encourage their child to report to school before they go home and 12% maybe
- We have planned 3 Trusted Adult Luncheons for the students that didn't identify trusted adults this month with 19 staff volunteers which include administrators, office staff, teachers, custodial staff, support staff, ECEs and lunch time supervisors. Luncheons are based on student interests and they will be fed.

Other Initiatives:

Science Fair Huge Success!

• Grades 6-8 students at Ecole Bellewood took part in the School Science Fair. This year we had 28 projects with 46 student participants. Student projects demonstrated emerging application of the scientific method, in creative and innovative ways to apply to real world problems. Topics included building better energy and irrigation systems, effectiveness of antibacterial materials, examinations of how perception influences personal bias and developing visual drug interactions programming. Judges were comprised of teachers, school board science specialists and parent/guardian volunteers with science backgrounds. Ten projects were selected to represent Ecole Bellewood in the upcoming Windsor Regional Science, Technology & Engineering Fair, hosted by St. Clair College on April 12th and 13th.

Indigenous Country/Blues Singer Crystal Shawanda Bellewood Performance

- Bellewood welcomes artist Crystal Shawanda and the Blues in the Schools program. Blues in the Schools is an opportunity to expose students from all backgrounds to music and to encourage them to use music as a positive outlet in dealing with the world around them. Crystal Shawanda was born and raised in Wikwemikong First Nation, on Manitoulin Island, in Northern Ontario.
- This presentation will take place as an assembly on April 8th from 1:30-2:15 and we invited the Indigenous families and extend the invitation to PIC.
