## Vice Principal's Report – Mr Roy:

- The students at Bellewood commemorated National Truth and Reconciliation in the themes of Early Years (Empathy), Primary (Resilience), Junior (Truth) and Intermediate (Reconciliation)
- The teachers were given an opportunity to learn about the personal experiences of vice principal's mother's time at Residential School
- The teachers were provided with learning materials/lessons to support their learning through the week of September 23rd September 27<sup>th</sup>
- Katie Harrington provided staff with resources to provide the students with 4 key focus points. K-1 focused on empathy, grades 2-3 focused on resilience, grades 4-6 focused on truth and gr 7-8 focused on reconciliation (call to action)
- The students created artwork to represent their learning from the week and posted in may places around the building for others to see
- We had an Every Child Matters Flag Raising Ceremony on September 23 and invited families that self-identify as Indigenous
- On National Day for Truth and Reconciliation we had a moment of reflection and teachers took their classes on a TRC Walk around the building to learn about what the other classes learned throughout the week
