Scenario	Action
Student expresses Duty to Report protection concern(s).	<ul> <li>Complete <u>CAS Reporting Form</u> or <u>https://connect.publicboard.ca/CAS/</u></li> <li>Report to Windsor Essex Children's Aid Society at 519-252-1171.</li> <li>Inform principal.</li> </ul>
Student expresses general worries.	<ul> <li>Listen and allow them to talk about it with you.</li> <li>Refer them to our webpage "Supporting all of us through COVID-19" for resources.</li> <li>Encourage students to complete the survey on above webpage.</li> <li>Remind them to get sleep, eat properly, exercise, and talk to friends.</li> </ul>
Student expresses concerns or sadness and would like to speak to someone.	<ul> <li>Refer student to Kids Help Phone - 1 800 668 6868 or text CONNECT to 686868.</li> <li>Inform principal of concern for possible social work consultation*.</li> </ul>
Student discloses a traumatic event.	<ul><li>Inform Principal directly.</li><li>Principal to contact designated Trauma/VTRA Supervisor.</li></ul>
Student discloses suicidal ideation	<ul> <li>Inform Principal of the suicidal ideation.</li> <li>Principal contacts parent/guardian and provides resources. ASIST training will guide the questions and how to refer to resources. Principal may consult with the Supervisor of Social Work Services.</li> </ul>
Student discloses that a suicide attempt is in progress.	<ul> <li>Speak to the parents/guardians directly. Otherwise, CALL 911 emergency services for immediate response.</li> <li>Parents/guardians may want to go directly to local hospital with student and not call 911. WRH-Met campus-15 years of age and younger, WRH- Ouellette campus-16 and over. Erie Shores Health Care in Leamington.</li> <li>Notify principal of call to the parents/guardians or 911.</li> <li>Principal to contact Supervisor of Social Work.</li> </ul>

## \*Guidelines for new referrals for social work consultations:

- Principal contacts school social worker (email or work extension) to consult about the student's situation with no reference to the student's name.
- Principal to gain verbal consent from the parent/legal guardian or student over 16 for school social worker to contact them confirming phone number. Principal to complete the social work consultation form documenting name of parent/guardian, date and time of verbal consent.
- Social worker will contact the family to discuss consent form, risks and benefits of telephone counseling and the issue of confidentiality.
