The library is open during first semester during the last period of the day. Second semester, the library is open for the afternoon. The library is also opened before school and at lunch each day.

Clarify the range of Special Education programming:

We offer a Transition Program which is a System placement for students with complex educational needs, we also offer adaptive basic level courses, K courses (non-credit, skill building courses) and modified/locally developed courses.

K Courses are courses designed to enhance the student's skills in literacy. Students focus on areas of improvement and work towards building confidence in their literacy skills before



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attempting a credit based course. Literacy work is designed to meet their individual learning styles.

Adaptive basic level courses are comprised of 14 or less students in a class, where the curriculum is geared to a grade 3 or less reading level in order to meet the needs of the student's learning profiles. These students work towards an Ontario Secondary School Certificate as opposed to the Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

Modified/locally developed courses are designed to meet the needs of students who are working toward an Ontario Secondary School Diploma.

All classes at Century Secondary School contain a range of accommodations, including, special education technology, in order to assist students in achieving their full potential.

What specialized programs or opportunities are unique to this location?

OYAP Hair and OYAP Cook programs. We also offer the SHSM Hospitality Certificate program.
