2. New construction dual track K-12 on Marlborough campus (Giles campus students + Marlborough and Forster) ~~Marlborough students south of Expressway/west of Ojibway transition to Sandwich West (2 students); Marlborough students north of ETR transition to Brock (39 students);~~ Giles campus boundary remains as is
Modification: Close Century: AB students relocate to Western and diploma students relocate to home schools

3. Board office at 451 Park St. **(71 thousand square feet)** relocates to Century **(12 thousand square feet)**; AB Century students stay; Forster closes and students transition to Marlborough site for a new K-12 dual track with Giles campus students; ESL may remain or move to Herman
Many of the same advantages and challenges as Number 2.

22. Century diploma students to home schools, Forster, AB to Century + OYAP, (520) close Forster
OMIT – DOES NOT MEET THE MANDATE

23. Close Marlborough and Forster, K-6 English at Brock, 7-12 English and k-8/12 FI a new school on Marlborough
OMIT – BROCK DOES NOT HAVE THE CAPACITY TO ACCOMMODATE THE AMOUNT OF STUDENTS

24. Forster, OYAP, AB Century students at Century; Century diploma students to home schools; close Forster; FI and Marlborough students at a new school on Marlborough site
This means that Century becomes the high school, FI plus Marlborough JK-8 (800 elem. students) high school would still be under capacity

26. Marlborough and FI students to Century (730 students); Forster and Century students at new building on Marlborough site (849 students); close Forster and Marlborough

OMIT – BROCK'S CAPACITY IS TOO SMALL
32. How about if we look at the situation from a perspective of assets and liabilities and work through until the situation is resolved?
1) Close Forster, Marlborough and Century as liabilities
2) Assets remaining: Brock Elementary Building and Students i.e.
Approximate Numbers:
500 at Forster (300 regular / 200 ELL)
400 at Century (100 AB / 300 Diploma Bound)
300 at Marlborough
600 French Immersion
280 at Brock
One new building will not house the more than 2000 students above (again only approximate, and I know the numbers are high). So juggle the assets among the system however we want to accommodate one new building and help out the rest of the system and fill Brock.

 FI to Herman (you can add McCallum to this too)
 close Giles, Century, Forster, Marlborough (McCallum)
 (could also go with a different grade school and more kids to other schools for the FI)
OMIT – NOT FEASIBLE FOR HERMAN SECONDARY
37. Close Forster - 9-12 @ Century (~~remove ESL from Forster = 700 total students~~)
~~Brock (K-8) plus ESL (early language acquisition stages only – later stages to home school as per~~
~~Newcomer Assessment) (approx. 400 students)~~
 Close Marlborough - new K-8 dual track on this site (approx. 800 total students) Giles closes
 Note: with room at Century, this could include option for FI 9-12 OR include on new site

15. Close Marlborough and Giles; New K- 8 dual track on Marlborough site

OMIT – DOES NOT ADDRESS SECONDARY SCHOOL ISSUE

8. Brock becomes K-6 dual track school; close Marlborough and build a new facility 7-12 dual track on the site. Also close Century, Forster, Giles, and transition to the new facility.

OMIT- BROCK SITE TOO SMALL; REQUIRES 7 CLASSROOM ADDITION

9. Brock becomes K-6 dual track school; close Marlborough build new facility 7-12 dual track: Century diploma seeking students to home schools; non diploma students (AB) at new Marlborough facility

OMIT- BROCK SITE TOO SMALL; REQUIRES 7 CLASSROOM ADDITION

20. Close Forster

Forster students' transition to Century, OYAP program relocates to Century; Century AB students transition to Herman, Century diploma seeking students serviced in home schools
