Student Outcomes at the School

Over the past three years, has the trend of the EQAO test scores been greater than, equal to, or less than the Board's average?

EQAO Grade 9 Mathematics.. Students in Academic math classes tend to perform better than the board average, while students in our Applied level classes perform lower than board average OSSLT Grade 10 Literacy test ... Our students were below the board average for 3 years but exceeded the Board average in 2013-14

Teacher librarian is assigned two periods semester 1 and one period semester 2. Intermediate students receive 50 minutes of library with elementary teacher over a 5 day cycle. Library is supervised at lunch 4 days a week and for $\frac{1}{2}$ of each period on a daily basis using secondary school teacher supervision time.
