I arrived on Turtle Island as a young girl from Portugal with my family. It is my own personal goal to be a helper, so that this generation and future generations understand the historical and current events that have impacted the relationship between Indigenous and non-Indigenous people on Turtle Island. I am extremely fortunate to work with a team of individuals dedicated to improving the educational experiences of First Nations, Métis and Inuit students within our School Board. I have been a teacher with the GECDSB for 20 years and have spent six of those years dedicated to Indigenous Education. I see my primary role as creating spaces for Indigenous voices, perspectives and history to be shared and learned. It is my responsibility to listen to the community and continuously educate myself. Within my role, I provide staff and students opportunities to learn the true history of Turtle Island using authentic learning resources, experiences and Indigenous voices. I also work in our system to help others recognize and understand that equitable access to support does not mean *equal* access for Indigenous students realities, barriers, and needs and responding to these needs in a way that creates a fair and inclusive learning experience for them.

I look forward to continuing to listen and learn from students, parents/guardians and staff in order to do the work with an open mind and heart.

Kwe' teluisi/hello my name is Toni Lauzon. I hold Master's degrees in Sociology and Social Work from the University of Windsor. I am a Social Worker and Attendance Counsellor for the GECDSB. I am half-time assigned to Indigenous students in this role. I believe that every student has gifts that may be realized and built upon. I work with students and their families from a strength-based, person and community centered approach while using a combination of Indigenous principles and practices of healing and mainstream therapeutic interventions. I live and work from a place of awareness of the impacts of colonization and intergenerational trauma while recognizing the resilience and abilities of our communities. We all struggle from time to time, asking for help is one of the greatest strengths and abilities a person can possess.

I also wanted to share with you that I've been working with many families to access educational supports and services through Jordan's Principle. Jordan's Principle aims to ensure that all First Nations children under the age of 19, can access all public services for unmet needs without experiencing denials, delays or disruptions. So far we have been successful in supporting children in receiving psychoeducational assessments, technology (iPads, laptops), professional services (i.e. speech and language) and in exceptional cases, EA support staff. If you have questions about Jordan's Principle or want more information about supports and services that are available through my Social Worker or Attendance Counselling role, please feel free to contact me. I look forward to supporting you and your children in any way I can.

In the spirit of reconciliation, our communities banded together to share stories and to educate and create awareness of the impact Residential Schools imposed on Indigenous people.

Our Open Minds Team held a virtual event that featured Mr. Cecil Isaac of the Bkejwanong Territory, Walpole Island. He told the story of how Residential Schools impacted generations within his family and community. He shared how the connection to cultural teachings has helped build the resilience required to move forward.

Early Years Virtual Visits

Every year, the Open Minds team does its best to make sure our students make smooth and successful transitions. In order to ensure our students know they have our support, we try to connect with early years students who identify as First Nations, Métis, or Inuit at the beginning of the school year. Considering this years' circumstances, the First Nations, Metis, & Inuit student support workers have been working to schedule virtual visits in each of the early years classrooms who have new Indigenous JK students to read aloud the story "My Heart Fills with Happiness." Even though this year looks so different, connecting with students and sharing stories with classes fill our hearts with happiness!

Please note, for students who have opted for offline packages, your support worker will connect with you to do a reading of the story, please contact us and we would be happy to set something up.

Welcome to Grade 9

Each year the Open Minds Program offers a gift to students as a welcome for starting Grade 9. The First Nations, Métis and Inuit Student Support Workers would also deliver the gift to each Grade 9 student at their school. Unfortunately we were not able to do that this year.

We still wanted to give the Grade 9's a gift so we decided to give them a welcome package to help them transition in this very different start to the new school year. The welcome package included:
