Building Awareness

There have been many opportunities for teacher and student learning this month, here are a few...

Indigenous Education in the Classroom: All staff were invited to learn with Nancy Rowe




Nancy Rowe is a Mississauga, Ojibwe of the Anishinaabek Nation located at Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation. Nancy holds an honors B.A. in Indigenous Studies and Political Science. She is an educator, consultant and a Traditional Practitioner of Anishinaabek lifeways, views and customary practices and is currently completing a Master's degree of Environmental Resource Studies at the University of Waterloo. She is an avid volunteer who coordinates Akinomaagaye Gaamik, a grassroots initiative to provide educational opportunities for all peoples interested in Indigenous perspectives of life, health, education, history and the environment.

This session explored how to use a human rights framework when planning and implementing activities pertaining to Indigenous Education. Nancy discussed the importance of cultural safety and the critical role that educators can play in creating safe and appropriate learning.

Infusing Indigenous Literature in the Classroom

These sessions were designed to assist educators teaching kindergarten to grade four, infuse Indigenous texts in their classrooms in meaningful and respectful ways. Teachers were provided age-appropriate literacy strategies and Indigenous children's book recommendations.

In Conversation with Kanahus Manuel



In collaboration with the DPCDSB we were able to offer access to a special live stream. This rare and special live stream featured Kanahus Manuel from the west coast (Secwepemc and Ktunaxa) who spoke to secondary students about current events taking place on Indigenous lands in British Columbia. This session was moderated by Isaac Murdoch (Serpent River First Nation) and together they highlighted the connections between colonialism and climate change, resource extraction and violence against Indigenous peoples, and how students can play an important role in solidarity and action movements. Opening and welcome by Nancy Rowe (Mississauga of the Credit First Nation).

Kanahus Manuel, or Kanahus Freedom, is an Indigenous activist, birth keeper, and a member of the activist group Tiny House Warriors. Manuel is a Secwepemc and Ktunaxa mother of four Freedom Babies, children raised in the spirit of decolonization and free from the regulations of the Canadian federal and provincial governments. Manuel decided to do this as an Indigenous woman to raise

questions about the inherent rights of Indigenous peoples of Canada. Manuel's father, Arthur Manuel wrote *The Reconciliation Manifesto* and *Unsettling Canada* and started the *Indigenous Network on Economies and Trade* organization. Caldwell First Nation Learning


