More than 2000 people are employed in Windsor-Essex County as hairstylists, barbers, estheticians, electrologists and related fields (2018) and this number is expected to grow (Workforce Windsor Essex, 2019).

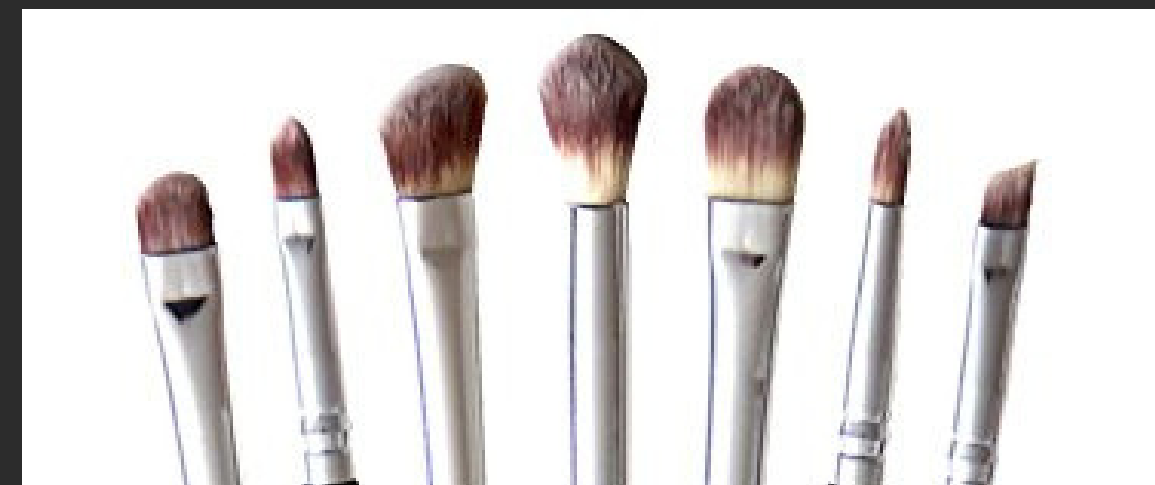
