

- 3. Maintain a daily routine Sticking to a routine can be comforting for those who crave structure in their lives.
- 4. Take a break Build in unstructured time to allow students to be creative.
- 5. **Teach self-care** Caring for oneself and having fun will help children stay balanced and better deal with stressful times.
- 6. Move toward your goals Teach your child to set reasonable goals and help them move toward them one step at a time.
- 7. Nurture a positive self-view Help your child remember ways they have successfully handled hardships in the past and help them understand that their past challenges help them build strength.
- 8. Keep things in perspective and maintain a hopeful outlook An optimistic and positive outlook can enable children to see the good things in life and keep going even in the hardest times.
- 9. Look for opportunities for self-discovery Tough times are often when children learn the most about themselves. Help your child take a look at how whatever they're facing can teach them "what am I made of."
- 10. Accept change Change often can be scary for children and teens. Help your child see that change is part of life and new goals can replace goals that have become unattainable

Edsby provides parents/guardians with the ability to book their own teacher conferences through your computer or mobile device. You can also log in by navigating to publicboard.edsby.com. There will be a new Parent-Teacher Interview booking form in your Message area (see below).

### Student Transportation, Inclement Weather & Driver Absence

For the current school year (2023-23), if student transportation is cancelled schools will be **open** unless otherwise notified by the school board. Students participating in in-person learning should report to school.

In the event of a bus driver absence, the operator will make every effort to replace drivers. This may result in some busses running late. Information related to bussing delays will be posted on the main page at **www.buskids.ca**. If the operator is unable to fill a vacancy, the applicable bus route will be cancelled. Cancellations will also be posted at **www.buskids.ca**. Parents and caregivers who created an account with Windsor-Essex Student Transportation Services will receive an email and a notification on the Buskids app notifying them of a bus cancellation. Parents and caregivers should be reminded to check www.buskids.ca an/or their email every morning before sending their child to the bus pick-up point.

#### **DRESS FOR THE WEATHER!**

Outdoor play is valuable and fresh air is healthy. Our students have two opportunities daily to be outside (recess and lunch) as well as times planned by teachers throughout the week. We believe in outdoor play and education and encourage students to enjoy their environment. Please have your children dress for the winter weather. Students stay indoors when the temperature is -20C with the wind chill.

## Allergy Aware School & Scent-Free Environment

We feel the best way to reduce the risk of accidental exposure to these students is to respectfully ask for the co-operation of the parents/guardians within this school community to NOT send in any food for special events, birthdays, etc. The only food that should be coming to school should be for your child's own personal consumption. 1. Ensure your child(ren) can access the passenger side exit of your vehicle, as well as their backpack and any items they are bringing with them to school.


- 2. Adults should always remain in their vehicle.
