

Student Transportation, Inclement Weather & Driver Absence

For the current school year (2023-24), if student transportation is canceled schools will be **open** unless otherwise notified by the school board. Students should report to school at their regular times (8:15am start for Southwood students).

In the event of a bus driver absence, the operator will make every effort to replace drivers. This may result in some busses running late. Information related to bussing delays will be posted on the main page at **www.buskids.ca**. If the operator is unable to fill a vacancy, the applicable bus route will be cancelled. Cancellations will also be posted at **www.buskids.ca**. Parents and caregivers who created an account with Windsor-Essex Student Transportation Services will receive an email and a notification on the Buskids app notifying them of a bus cancellation. Parents and caregivers should be reminded to check www.buskids.ca an/or their email every morning before sending their child to the bus pick-up point.

Allergy Aware School & Scent-Free Environment



Within our school community there are several students who have potentially life-threatening allergies (anaphylaxis) to foods. We respectfully ask for the co-operation of the parents/guardians within this school community to NOT send in any food for special events, birthdays, etc. The only food that should be coming to school should be for your child's own personal consumption. 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
