Christmas is the annual Christian festival celebrating Christ's birth, held on December 25th. It is a religious and cultural celebration among billions of people around the world. Christmas dinners are also an important part of the celebrations. Families and friends will share food together, eating traditional foods, such as turkey, mince pies and Christmas puddings.


Hanukkah is the Jewish eight-day, wintertime "festival of lights," celebrated with a nightly menorah lighting, special prayers and fried foods. It begins on the 25th day of Kislev, the ninth month of the Hebrew calendar and continues for eight days. This year it lands on December 18th to December 26th. The Hebrew word Hanukkah means "dedication," and is thus named because it celebrates the rededication of the Holy Temple. To celebrate the ancient miracle of the oil burning a candle for eight nights, Jews celebrating Hanukkah light a candleholder called a menorah for eight nights. The menorah holds nine candles-one for each night plus a candle called the shamash used to light the other candles. People recite special blessings and prayers, sing songs, and exchange gifts to celebrate.


Kwanzaa is an annual holiday affirming African family and social values that is celebrated from December 26 to January 1. Both the name and the celebration were devised in 1966. The name Kwanzaa is derived from a Swahili phrase (matunda ya kwanza) meaning "first fruits," and is a seven-day celebration that comprises traditional African harvest festivals and draws on activities from cultures across Africa. The sevenday celebration represents the seven values of nguzo saba: Umoja (Unity), Kujichagulia (Self-determination), Ujima (Collective Work and Responsibility), Ujamaa (Cooperative Economics), Nia (Purpose), Kuumba (Creativity), and Imani (Faith).
