#### Dear Southwood Families.

### Student Attendance Procedures



At the Greater Essex County District School Board, **"Every Day Counts"**. Ensuring that your child attends school regularly and arrives on time is the best way to get the most out of our programs. If your child will be absent, please call the school at **(519) 969-3470**. You can leave a message before and after school hours, 24 hours a day on our attendance line.

Edsby is also available 24 hours a day to report absences and planned absences. If it is necessary for your child to be dismissed early, please send your child's teacher a note or call the office. If you are picking up your child before dismissal, please come to the office to sign your child out. Thanks to our parents for helping to make our school a safe and secure place to learn!



#### Allergy Aware School & Scent-Free Environment



Within our school community there are several students who have potentially life-threatening allergies (anaphylaxis) to foods. Food allergies are predominately to peanuts and/or nuts, but may also include eggs, egg by-products, fish, and berries. Parents/Guardians are asked to **please check the ingredients of all the foods your children bring to school** (snacks and lunches), and avoid sending peanut butter or products with peanuts or nuts listed in the ingredients. We feel the best way to reduce the risk of accidental exposure to these students is to respectfully ask for the co-operation of the parents/guardians within this school community to NOT send in any food for special events, birthdays, etc. The only food that should be coming to school should be for your child's own personal consumption. Thank-you for your assistance in keeping all of our students safe! We appreciate your co-operation and understanding. We would also like to remind our community that we are a scent-free environment to protect our students and staff who have allergies and sensitivities to the chemicals contained in products with fragrances. Please help us maintain a safe environment to make our school a comfortable learning environment for all members in our community.





### **Important Safety Message for Families**

As parents and educators, one of our foremost concerns is the safety and well-being of our children. Periodically it is important to remind our children of how they can keep themselves safe while in the community. Please reinforce with your children the importance of the following safety precautions:

- Never walk alone.
- Choose one route to school and always take that route.
- Walk to and from school directly, don't stop to play and let a parent know when you have arrived home.
- Walk on the sidewalk well away from parked or moving cars (not down an alley).
- If you are at a traffic light, remember to continue across the street if the sign turns to "Don't Walk" while you are crossing.
- You should cross the street only at corners or pedestrian crosswalks.
- Do not cross the street from between parked cars.
- Never talk to a stranger or accept anything from a stranger.
- If someone approaches you or tries to speak with you or follow you run to the nearest store, school or familiar location.
- If you are approached or notice someone watching you tell your parent/guardian or a school staff member immediately.
- Never touch or pick up sharp objects such as needles or broken glass. Report the discovery to an adult.

This message is a precautionary measure to keep our children safe. If you have any concerns regarding something you observe or child reports you should contact the police immediately.



# Message from Windsor Essex Student Transportation Services

As band practice resumes, this is a reminder of Policy GT-032 - Transportation of Equipment on School Buses

Statement	Transportation of large items that are not secured in the bus pose a safety hazard to the students riding the bus. If the vehicle has to stop suddenly, items can become projectiles causing injury to students <b>or the driver</b> . In order to provide a safe riding environment equipment on the school bus is limited.					
Procedures	ceduresEquipment may not be brought on the bus except as follows:1. Skates and Hockey Equipment - hockey equipment shall not be transported to and from school on a bus. Skates may be transported provided the blades are covered by guards and carried in the student's backpack.					
	<b>2. Musical Instruments</b> - musical instruments may be transported if they can be <b>secured in the student's backpack</b> .					
	3. Skateboards/Scooters/Roller Blades - skateboards, scooters and roller blades shall not be transported on a school bus.					
	<ol> <li>Other - any objects that are large and cannot be secured on a student's lap shall not be transported.</li> </ol>					
	N.B. Items brought on the bus cannot take up a seat on the bus. If there is a question about the items to be transported the decision will be brought forward to WESTS by the principal for final determination.




Home > Education and training
