WCCA Program:

Located at Walkerville Collegiate Institute, WCCA is a school within a school. We offer the only extended "Arts Program" in this region. We offer enriched art credit courses in the following disciplines: Visual Arts, Media Arts, Dance, Dramatic Arts, Instrumental Music (Band), Keyboards (Piano), Guitar, Strings, and Vocal Music. Students are expected to maintain a 70% average in their chosen discipline, as well as in all their other subjects, in order to continue to the next level and regular attendance is mandatory.

Dance

Classes are provided for novice to advanced dancers who demonstrate an aptitude, interest and commitment to dance. Students concentrate on ballet, jazz and modern dance, and have the opportunity to explore other genres such as hiphop and ballroom. They also learn theory, choreography, anatomy and history of dance.

Dramatic Arts

Students develop their skills and learn the necessary techniques to pursue post-secondary drama training. Students learn acting styles, theatre history, improvisation, musical theatre, design and other elements of drama. Experts in the field of entertainment technology tutor students in lighting, sound and other aspects of backstage work. Students have the opportunity to perform in a variety of productions each year, and in senior levels may study advanced acting, improvisation, production and directing, learning the work of director, designer, dramaturge, stage manager and performer.

Vocal Music

Students receive instruction in vocal technique for a variety of vocal styles – folk songs, music theatre, jazz, and classical. Students sing individually and in an ensemble during class. Topics such as music theory, history, the creative process, and critical thinking are addressed throughout the program.

Piano

Students are provided with an individualized program suited to fit their needs and interests, and may choose to focus on playing more traditional piano music and/or jazz and pop music. Students have the opportunity to examine concepts related to theory, music appreciation, composition, and critical thinking.

Guitar

Guitarists study both popular and classical styles using acoustic instruments. Students are expected to learn music theory and history as it pertains to the guitar.

Band

Students have an opportunity to develop technical and expressive musical skills that prepare them to perform in a variety of genres and pursue music at the post-secondary level. Each student has weekly one-to-one and small group lessons with an expert in their instrument, and performs as part of the WCCA Concert Band. Senior students perform in chamber ensembles, the WCCA Wind Ensemble and as soloists.

Strings

Violin, Viola, Cello and Bass players are mentored by expert tutors in a small group setting. Students work on solo repertoire and technique for evaluation as well as preparing ensemble pieces for community performances. Music theory is also an integral part of learning.

Media Arts

Students have the opportunity to creatively explore new media. The introduction year focuses on photography, digital imaging, video, and multimedia. These foundational skills can be expanded in higher level courses that explore the creative use of digital media.

Visual Arts


This program develops to a high degree of excellence the concepts of drawing, painting, printmaking and sculpture. Studies focus on more complex theories and techniques as well as self-criticism and self-evaluation. The development of a portfolio is a key component.

Click on "Can I Ride a Bus?"


Enter your address

You will receive a contract to be signed and returned to the school during the first week of September. Once submitted, you will then receive a voucher within a week, to take to the bus depot. Please make sure to have transportation arranged until you receive your voucher.
