



School Climate Survey – Spring 2015

The purpose of the school climate survey is to strengthen our system and our individual schools by celebrating our strengths, acknowledging our weaknesses and planning the next steps to ensure positive learning and working environments for everyone.

- Data for the student and parent surveys conducted in the Spring of 2015 indicates:

Unfortunately, we had a minimal response from parents (0.8%), and Junior Grade students (2 students); however, there was a 25% response rate from the Intermediate students (Grades 7 & 8) who indicated that they felt safe and welcomed at school. Students responded that they did not feel bullied, but knew that they could and should report any unsafe incidents to staff in the building, and that the incidents would be addressed. The Intermediate respondents also stated that they felt well prepared for secondary school.

- The survey results demonstrate a need to review:

It is important that the school continue to strive to develop a sense of cohesiveness between the former Victoria Public School families and the current A.V. Graham families. It is interesting to note that the current A.V. Graham community includes former Victoria Public School and former DM Eagle students.

- As a result of the school climate survey we will:

Continue to provide a safe and welcoming environment for all students, staff, parents and visitors to the school. Plans are already in place to continue and expand anti-bullying awareness through student-led activities.
