



School Climate Survey 2017

The purpose of the school climate survey is to strengthen our system and our individual schools by celebrating our strengths, acknowledging our weaknesses and planning the next steps to ensure positive learning and working environments for everyone.

- Data for the student and parent surveys conducted in the Winter of 2017 indicates:
 - At John Campbell we have worked hard the last few years to instill confidence and a positive attitude toward learning. Our results indicate a large majority of students like who they are, and identify the school helps them to understand and learn about themselves.
 - Having strong connections and a sense of community through daily activities, school events and parent engagement was a focus for John Campbell in the 2016-2017 school year. We are a team at John Campbell and want our students and families to understand we listen and work together for a successful and memorable year. A large majority of respondents identified having friendships, a connection to school activities and adults at home and school they feel comfortable speaking with.
 - When students were asked if they felt safe in a variety of inside and outside locations within our school, a majority of respondents indicated they felt safe on school grounds.
 - We are excited to see a group of wonderful grade 8's graduate and prepare for Secondary School. The majority of our intermediate students indicated they have participated in events to help prepare them for high school, are aware of activities at their new school and they are excited for this new adventure.
 - We would like to thank the parents that participated in our School Climate Survey this year. Families that completed the survey shared they feel welcome at John Campbell, recognize the caring adults at school, and are aware of their child's progress.

- The majority of staff at John Campbell believe students feel safe at school. They believe the school has strategies to address bullying and is taken seriously.
- The survey results demonstrate a need to review:
 - A few students have indicated they would like to learn about experiences and achievements for a variety race, religions and disabilities.
 - Some families have indicated the desire to better understand the school code of conduct.
- As a result of the school climate survey we will:
 - In the 2017-2018 school year at John Campbell we will inform families and students where they can find information on the school code of conduct, and review classroom and school expectations with students for a successful school year.
 - Continue to educate staff on community building activities, and focus on character education to assist with creating a safe environment where perseverance and Growth Mindset qualities are appreciated and strived for.
