7. News from the Classroom

Dana Di Vincenza, Educational Coordinator, presented on the upcoming Mindforce Competition on Saturday, April 30, 2016 at Tecumseh Vista Academy. Mindforce is a creative problem-solving competition based up the idea that creativity is a skill that can be taught and developed with practice. Participants are Kindergarten to Grade 12 and compete within divisions. Spectators are welcome.

6. Ministry of Education

Joy Antoniuk and Virginia Rutledge from the Southwest Regional Office based in London attended to explain the role of SEAC and answer questions. The London office serves 16 school boards, 3 school authorities and 3 provincial/demonstration schools.

Members of SEAC represent their agency but as a committee, SEAC represents all students with special needs.

Role of SEACs:

- Make recommendations
- Provide information to parents, as requested
- Consultation
- Participate in the board annual review of its Special Education Plan
- Participate in the board's annual budget process as it relates to special education
- Review the financial statements of the board as they relate to special education.

The officers informed the committee that what is next in 16-17 is:

- Differentiated Special Education Needs Amount (DSENA) will be replacing the High Needs Amount with full implementation in 17-18
- Renewed Math Strategy and Special Education
- Development of a Provincial Alternative Curriculum
- Special Education Handbook
- Development of New Definitions Supporting Students with Giftedness, Intellectual or Behaviour Needs

8. Special Education Plan

L. McLaughlin reviewed the changes from March with the committee. Next month the numbers of GAINS and STEPS classrooms should be finalized. For qualifications of staff (which is new this year) a notation will be inserted before the staff numbers to explain the different way it appears on the chart. Qualifications were not included in the past. The finalized staff numbers for ESS may not be available until the final version in June. Information on IBI will be provided in the May version. The addition of the acronyms SWDHH and SLP should be added to the list. The final version will be finished at the June meeting to go to the Board for approval.

9. Special Education Update

Renaming of the Adaptive Basic Program - Each member was to indicate their top 3 preferred names from the list provided. The recommendations will go to the Senior Administration who will make the final decision.

LD@school video was filmed on March 22nd at Tecumseh Vista Academy.

M. Wilcox reported on the meeting for the Provincial Schools. M. Wilcox and Kim Dugal, Itinerant Teacher for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing attended. We gave our input and now are waiting to hear back. The GECDSB does not send as many students as other boards due to parental choice regarding the distance.

M. Wilcox informed the committee that the Elementary Special Olympics is on May 13th. The Secondary is on May 16th. Rain date is May 17th.

L. McLaughlin stated that she will invite Tim McCarthy to the next meeting to speak to the information received this week from the Ministry of Children and Youth Services on Improving Autism Services. It is not known at this time how it will affect children in our school boards.
