Mills – staff are receiving more PD regarding the IEP process. We did have PD last year and it helped answer many questions. Ed Coordinators and LSTs are doing training. There was much discussion about clarity around IEPs. We need to follow the IEP and students and families need to know how to proceed to best help their child through this transition.

M. Vukov – when students graduate secondary school, they need something in place to transition to postsecondary. Parents have to take care of this themselves at this point.
