#### SPECIAL EDUCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

March 10, 2020

M. Wilcox discussed the letter that the GECDSB SEAC committee sent to the Minister of Education in support of the DDSB letter to the Minister of Education regarding Minister's Advisory Council on Special Education (MACSE). A copy of this letter was also sent to all Ontario School Board SEAC Committees. All boards were asked to submit to MACSE, celebrations and challenges from this school year. M. Wilcox shared his input to MACSE with the SEAC committee. This information/feedback is to support discussion at the next MACSE meeting.

There was also discussion around Soutinere (Empower) for French Immersion students. M. Wilcox suggested that we have A. Humber present at a future SEAC Committee meeting to discuss this program.

K. Wilson asked how we assist students with most challenging needs. M. Wilcox responded that we do have intensive support for students to keep them in school. We would be more than willing to review opportunities to partner with outside organizations that deal with challenging students. M. Fuduric added that we need more reading programs. According to M. Fuduric, reading is not being taught at the Faculty of Education.

#### 5. Special Education Update

#### PD Update:

- Data is being gathered from the After School Skills Development Program. S. Mulcaster will present at a future SEAC meeting to discuss the data.
- K. Sweet shared that we are partnering with the Program Department to provide more support for early years teachers. This will help determine PD for the next school year.
- M. Wilcox added that a Gifted Committee has been formed. They are looking to move forward with a review of what types of programming and resources we have for students and how to build on it. The Faculty of Business at the University of Windsor partnered with us this year providing four days of programming for students identified as gifted from grade 5 to 8. Due to work sanctions, we only were able to participate for one day this year but the feedback was amazing! We look forward to next year. B. Turner asked if students in the gifted program were identified students on an IEP. M. Wilcox responded that students identified as gifted are on an IEP. It was acknowledged that there is no gifted program.

#### Special Education Plan:

- M. Wilcox and K. Sweet went over revisions for standards 11 16 of the Special Education Plan. It was shared that budgets may arrive to boards later this year.
- It was approved by the Ministry of Education this year to use SEA funds for Lexia licenses.
