#### 1. Call to Order

M. Fuduric called the meeting to order at 1:08 pm.

#### **2.** Approval of the Agenda

## 3. Approval of Minutes

## 4. Business Arising as a Result of the Minutes

M. Fuduric expressed concern regarding the review of various items at the June 2019 meeting. M. Wilcox replied that these items will be reviewed earlier in the school year to avoid this in the future. He also explained that because there were so many changes to the Special Education Plan last year, this took up more time than expected.

## 5. Behaviour Management Team Presentation

T. McCarthy, Behaviour Management Specialist, explained the tiers for students with special needs.

Tier 1: universal research-based supports for students (approximately 80% of students).

Tier 2: some students may need more targeted supports in addition to Tier 1 supports (approximately 15% of students).

Tier 3: few students may need intensive supports in addition to Tier 1 and 2 supports (approximately 5% of students).

He also explained the referral process to obtain these supports, and explained the different roles involved in the Tier'd support.

The question was asked if there has been an increase in students with special needs. M. Wilcox responded that there has been an increase over the past few years and this has been the case across the province. He added that the GECDSB has had much PD over the years for support staff and administrators.

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## **6**. Special Education Update

• Special Education Plan – moving forward

M. Wilcox let the committee know that the Special Education Plan will be reviewed earlier in the year.

Ministry Professional Assessment Funding

The GECDSB received \$187,000. Half of this funding was used on assessments. We were able to do 69 additional assessments (students on wait lists) because of this funding. There has been very positive feedback from parents. The remainder of the funding went toward assessment tools for Speech and Language Pathologists, and for our I.T. department to produce an electronic tracking system.

School Skills Development Program

There were 10 pilot boards last year involved in the program. We received \$280,000 spread over the next three years. The funds will be used to help students develop social and academic skills. The Lambton-Kent Board is currently using the program. We will visit their Board to see how the program is running.
