Introduction of Ros Salvador – Human Rights and Equity System Advisor K. Sweet introduced and welcomed Ros Salvador to the GECDSB. Ros is an experienced human rights lawyer and will work with the board to strengthen equity-minded policies within the board.

Board Improvement and Equity Plan Draft

K. Sweet outlined the GECDSB Board Improvement and Equity Plan (BIEP) with the SEAC committee. The BIEP establishes educational priorities, goals and performance indicators to support continuous quality improvement as to achievement, equity and well-being for all students. Domains of the BIEP are:

  - Re-engaging students
  - Early reading and math
- Provincial Priority: Achievement
  - Improve math achievement
  - > Improve literacy achievement
  - Improve conditions for learning
- Provincial Priority: Human Rights and Equity
  - Build human rights and equity capacity through representative accountable and ethical leadership
  - Support the implementation of de-streaming
  - Reduce discretionary student discipline
  - Address human right complaints and hate-based incidents
- Provincial Priority: Mental Health, Well-Being and Engagement
  - Improve student mental health and well-being
  - > Improve student, parent and community engagement
- Provincial Priority: Pathways and Transitions
  - Improve graduation rate
  - Improve readiness for future success
