 <u>Call to Order</u> M. Wilcox called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

### Land Acknowledgement

We acknowledge that we are on land and surrounded by water, originally inhabited by Indigenous Peoples who have travelled this area since time immemorial. This territory is within the lands honoured by the Wampum Treaties; agreements between the Anishinaabe (Ah-nish-e-naa-bay), Haudenosaunee (Hoe-den-oh-show-nee), Lenni (Len-eh) Lenape (Le-naw-pay) and allied Nations to peacefully share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes. Specifically, we would like to acknowledge the presence of the Three Fires Confederacy, Ojibwe (Oh-jib-way), Odawa (Oh-dah-wah), Potawatomi (Paw-taw-watt-oh-me) and Huron/Wendat (Wen-dat) Peoples. - 3. <u>Business Arising as a Result of the Minutes</u> There was no business arising as a result of the minutes.
- Special Education Presentation Update on Special Education/Covid-19, M. Wilcox and K. Sweet Moving to In-Person for our Students in GAINS and STEPS
  - Students in GAINS and STEPS classes were given the option to return to in-person learning starting January 6, 2022. All other students were directed to remote learning by the Ministry of Education, until Monday, January 17, 2022.

- Transportation was set up for GAINS and STEPS students to return on January 6, 2022.
- Additional safety precautions were put in place such as N95 masks being delivered to schools that have GAINS and STEPS classrooms.
- If families opted out of in-person learning, they were provided with the short-term option of having a remote learning package provided.
- Approximately 86% of GAINS students and 80% of STEPS students have chosen inperson learning.
- Our Board Certified Behaviour Analysts (BCBAs) are supporting in-person for those students who require it.
- Our Itinerant teachers for Blind/Low Vision and Deaf/Hard of Hearing are supporting students both virtually and in-person.
- Behaviour Management Team members are support students virtually.
- Speech and Language Pathologists and Psychological Services Staff are focused on writing reports and case notes, and will continue to support students virtually and inperson.

Special Education Plan, M. Wilcox and K. Sweet

- The Special Education Plan will be reviewed with SEAC in sections
- The entire Plan will be provided for SEAC members to review prior to the next meeting
- SEAC members may request paper copies of the plan to review and it will be mailed to them
- Some sections will have to wait until after the new budget is released to provide accurate information

We have a Wellness Specialist Appointment February 8, 2022 with Kids Help Phone and then will begin our first sessions with Jordin TooToo on February 17, 2022.

M. Fuduric, Learning Disabilities Association of Windsor-Essex County – Started with 1:1 tutoring on January 10, 2022. Reading Buddies will begin on January 17, 2022.
